In 2013 Kingswood had approximately 1000 members.

In 2018 when the merger went through it had approximately 800 members, which Peninsula has only retained approximately 250 members.

Kingswood held many weddings and functions there.

Kevin Poulter's daughter was married at Kingswood and his parents celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary in the Clubhouse.

The board at the time surprisingly appointed a very ineffective person as head of membership.

When the decision was made to merge, the golfing world was stunned.

The closest 18 hole course is Sandringham and that is 1hr 21 minutes on public transport.

Mr. Telly stated Kingswood was run by a very poor administration. It couldn't have been that bad because the

- Manager,
- Club golf professional
- Head of membership
- Bar manager and
- most of the staff
- · even the president
- And four of Kingswood board members were engaged by Peninsula.

Mr. Telly was right about something, Kingswood had NO DEBT. Peninsula was \$4 million in debt.

So it was not a merger.

If this gets the go ahead with 3 storeys, every home in Dingley Village will be purchased by a developer, bulldozed and three storey apartments will be built, resulting in utter chaos in the Village for ever.

Won't be a village it will be an overcrowded under facilitated monster.
